**EMT Refresher Programs (EMT200, EMT200AA, EMT200AB and EMT201)**  
**Precourse Information**

EMT Refresher Student:

**Prerequisites:**

1. Current AZ or NR EMT-B certification or AZ certification less than two years expired.
2. \*Current Healthcare Provider CPR or equivalent. Proof of current Healthcare Provider CPR certification is required on the first day of class.  
\*Those students with proof that they are less than 30 days expired (AHA only) will be given an opportunity to renew their AHA Healthcare Provider CPR certification. Students who do not have their AHA CPR card are not eligible.

**Eligibility:**

Those with a current Arizona or National Registry certification are eligible for the EMT refresher class. Those with an Arizona certification that is less than two years expired are also eligible. All students are required to provide a copy of their State and National Registry certification card, as well as CPR on the first day of class. Those with an expired AZ certification who do not have a current National Registry card will be required to take the NR exam. Eligibility questions should be directed to the Arizona Department of Health Services, Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (602) 364-3186. The EMT Dept. does not interpret AZ BEMS or NR rules for students.

**CPR Requirement:**

CPR training is not provided as a part of the EMT refresher course. Students are required to provide a copy of their current CPR card on the first day of class. No exceptions! The card must be Healthcare Provider Level or equivalent. Those less than 30 days expired with an AHA Healthcare Provider level card will be given an opportunity to renew their card. Students should be prepared to take the AHA written exam and practical skills on the first day of class. Students who do not meet the CPR requirement will not be allowed to participate in the course. Contact the EMT Department if you have questions about your CPR status. It is the student's responsibility to meet the CPR requirement by the first day of class.

**Texts:**

1. Any EMT or EMT refresher textbook based on the 1994 DOT curriculum (required).
2. All other materials are optional.

**Attendance:**

Students are required to attend all class sessions. There are no excused absences. Any student who misses more than four hours will be removed from class. Missed content, up to four hours, will be made up as determined by the instructor. Students removed for excessive absences will be required retake the EMT 200 course.

**Grading:**

Successful completion of the EMT 200 course requires a grade of Pass on all final practical skills and at least 75% on the final written exam on the first attempt. The final exam consists of 150 multiple-choice questions. Following successful completion of all final practical skills, the final grade is based on the final exam score as follows:

- A = 92% - 100%
- B = 91% - 84%
- C = 83-80%
- F = 79% and below (no D grades issued)

**Practical Skills Evaluation:**

Practical skills are graded pass/fail. A grade of pass requires at least 80% of the total points possible for the skill without violating any listed critical criteria. Students will be given a total of three attempts to

complete a final practical skill. Students who fail any final practical skill three times must repeat the course. Students who fail at least four of the final practical skills must also repeat the course.

**National Registry:**

Those desiring National Registry certification are required to take the NR written exam after completing the EMT refresher course. There is a \$20 fee for the NR exam. Your instructor will provide the necessary NR application and information about registering for the NR exam.

**Note:** The only accommodation that the National Registry and DHS permit is additional time on the written examination for those who can document a reading disability. Students should recognize that although the instructor may provide additional accommodations during class, this does not mean those same accommodations will be provided during the National Registry exam.
