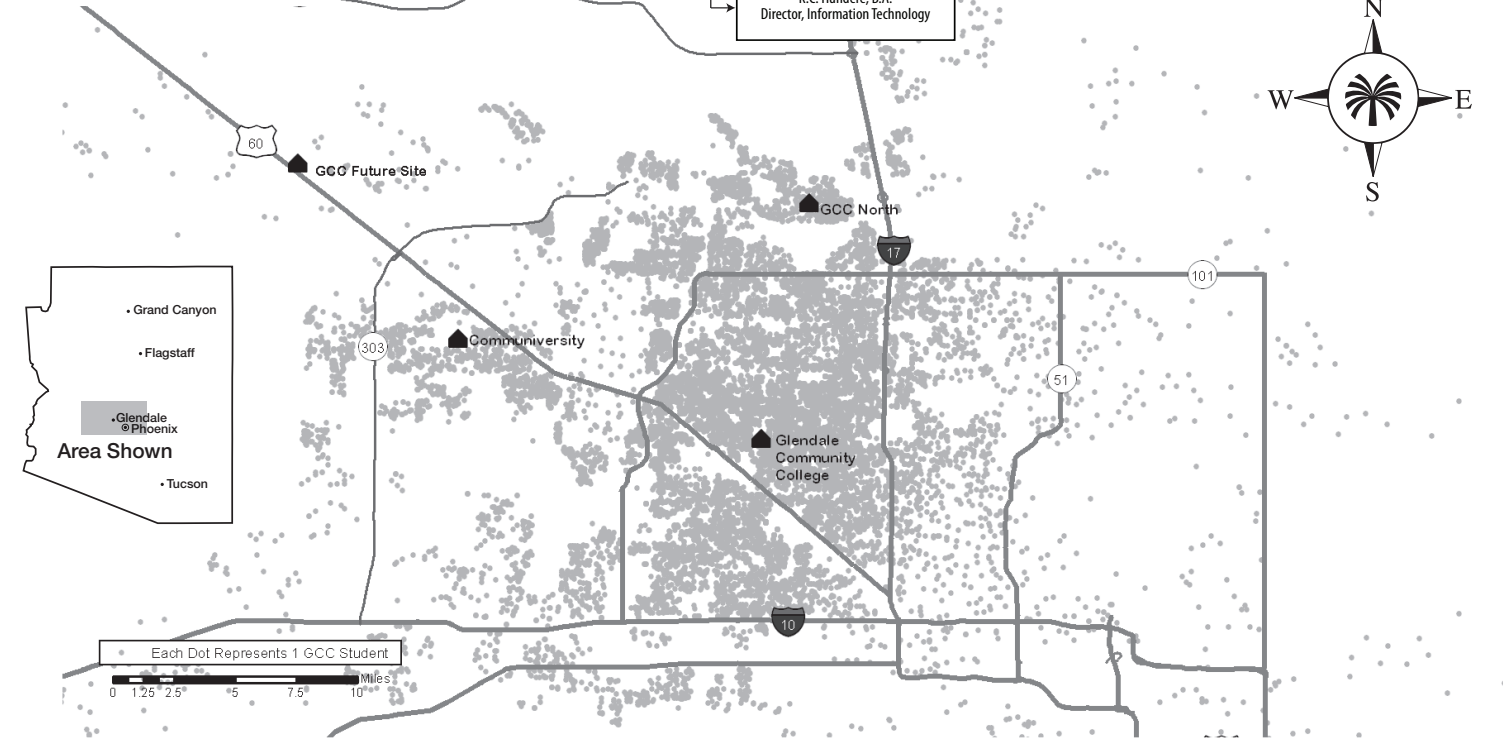

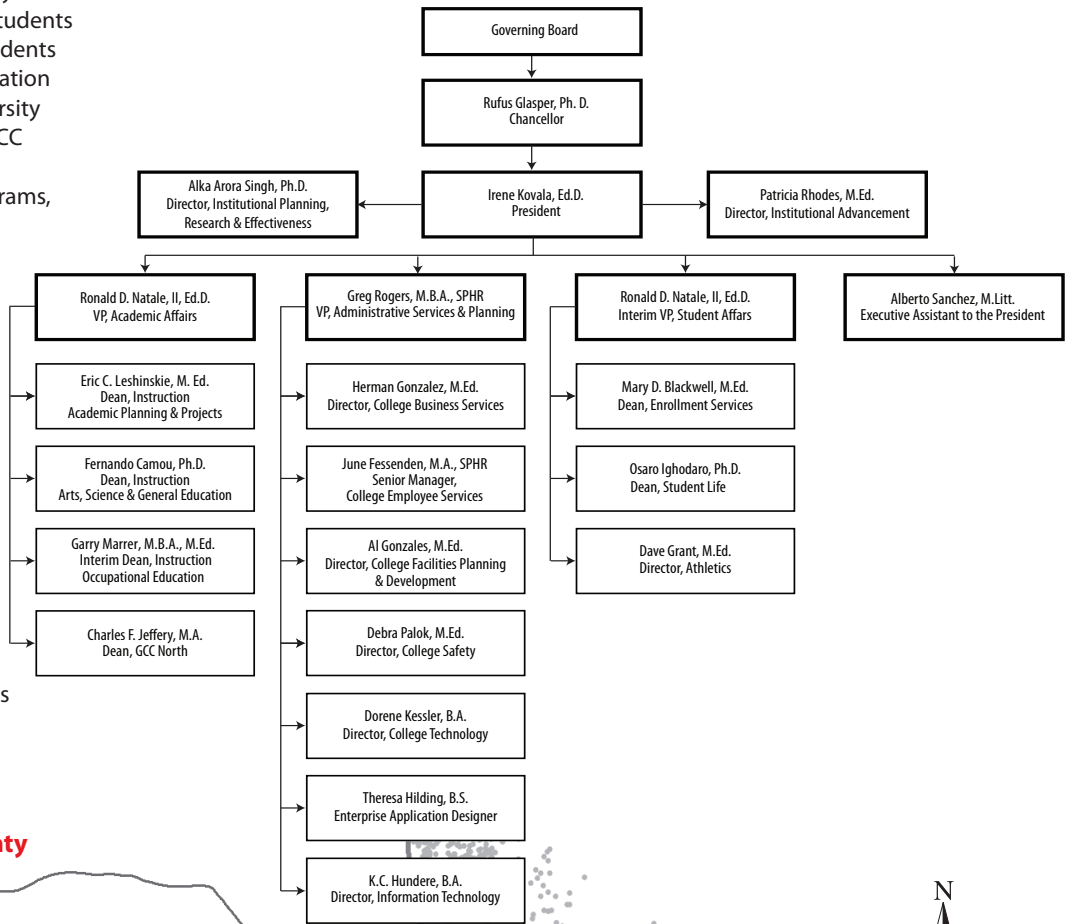

Fall 2011 Student Headcount

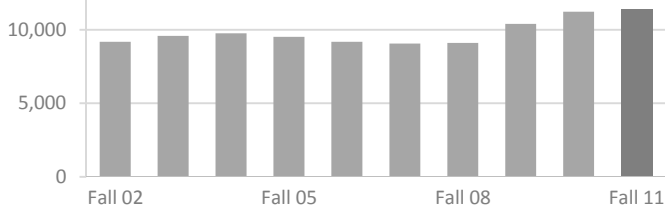


GCC Administration Organization Chart

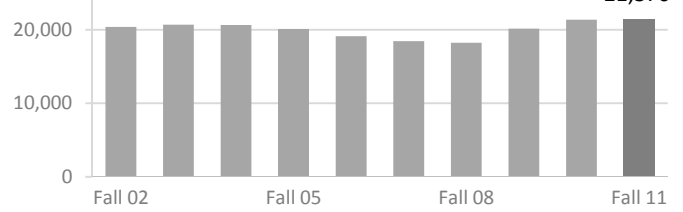




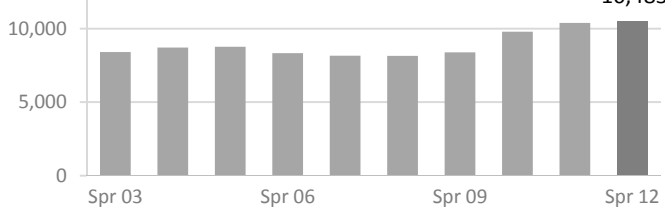
Fall Basic FTSE (Full-Time Student Equivalent) 11,429



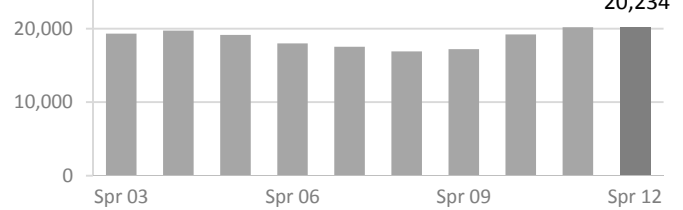
Fall 45th Day Student Headcount 21,376



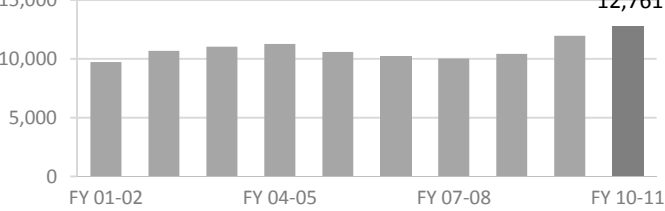
Spring Basic FTSE 10,483



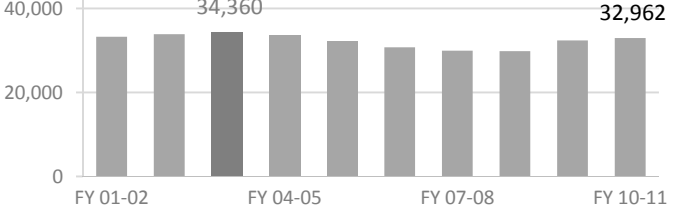
Spring 45th Day Student Headcount 20,234



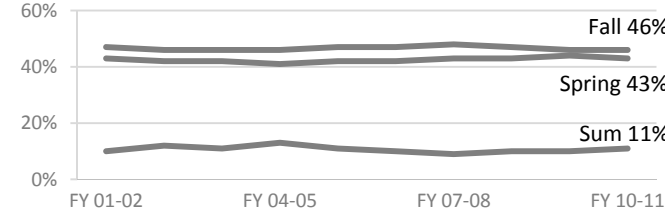
Fiscal Year FTSE (Jul 1 - Jun 30) 12,761



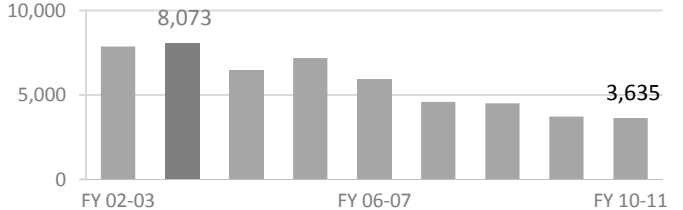
Fiscal Year Credit Student Headcount 32,962



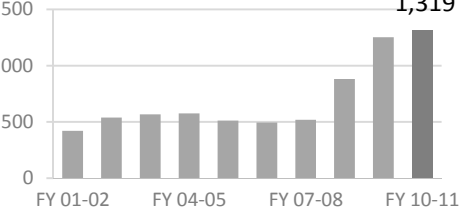
Term Contribution to Fiscal Year FTSE



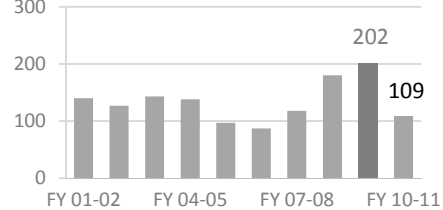
Fiscal Year Non-Credit Student Headcount 8,073



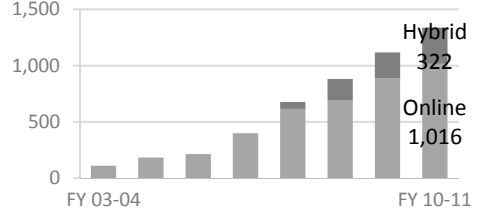

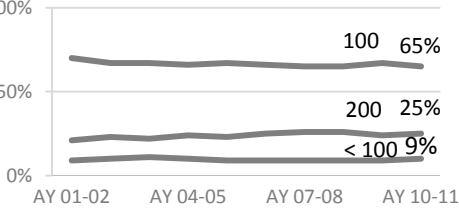

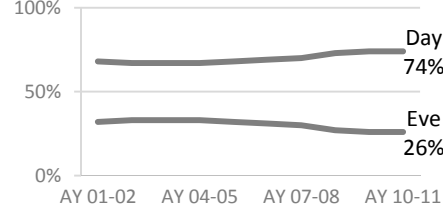

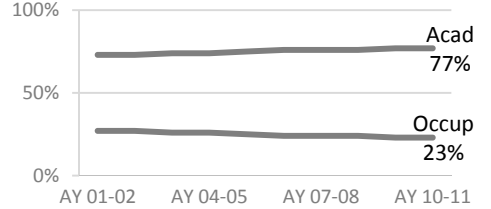
Credit Hours by Course Level



Credit Hours by Day/Evening



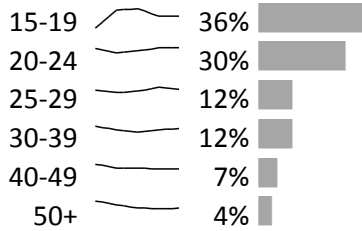
Credit Hours by Academic/Occupational



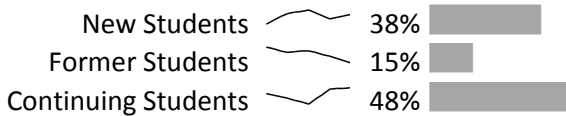

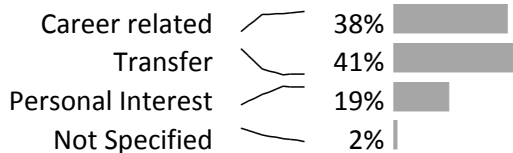


Primary Time of Attendance

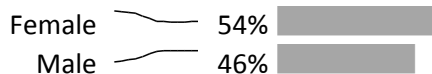

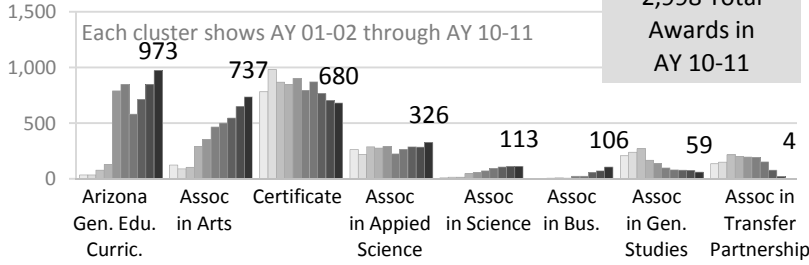

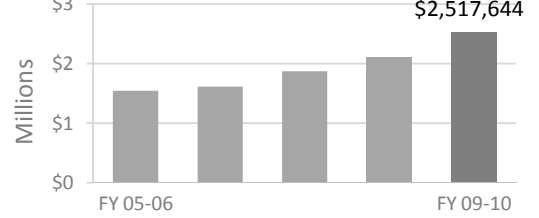




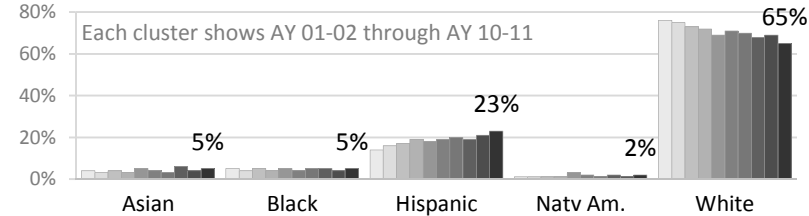
Degrees & Certificates Awarded: by Degree



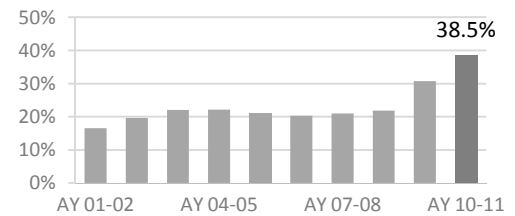
Scholarship Dollars Awarded

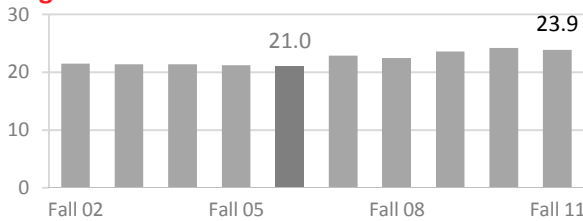

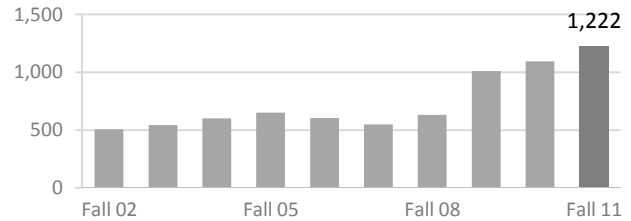
