### **Course Description**

A descriptive analysis of the structure and functioning of the American economy. Emphasis is on basic institutions and factors that determine national income and employment levels. Consideration is given to the macroeconomic topics of national income, unemployment, inflation, and monetary and fiscal policies. Prerequisites: none.
